1. Pray for them.

Lord God, no one is a stranger to you and no one is ever far from your loving care. In your kindness, watch over refugees and victims of war, those separated from their loved ones, young people who are lost, and those who have left home or who have run away from home. Bring them back safely to the place where they long to be and help us always to show your kindness to strangers and to all in need. Grant this through Christ our Lord.

2. Contact the local group. Refugees Welcome in Richmond are working with the Council to find accommodation for the Syrian refugees the Government has already agreed to accept under the UN sponsored Syrian Vulnerable Persons Relocation Scheme. They are looking for private landlords willing to offer self-contained accommodation at local housing benefit rates. On 30th June they are holding an awareness event, "**Stories out of Syria**", at the Waldegrave Drawing Room, St Mary's University, Twickenham, TW1 4SX.
