First Holy Communion Programme 2017/18

Application forms are on the table in the porch. Please hand completed forms to Fr Tom. In order to make their 1st Communion next June, children must have been **born on or before August 31st 2010**, be attending Mass weekly and be in School Year 3. A detailed timetable will be given to parents as soon as possible. Children are expected to attend classes from 4.00-5.30pm each Saturday afternoon during term time from the commencement of the programme in the Autumn Term until the Communion takes place in mid-June 2018. Parents will also be expected to attend a number of meetings on Saturday afternoons. Please include an e-mail address on the form and attach a copy of your child's Baptism certificate only if he/she was baptised outside the parish.

The closing date for applications is 30th September 2017. Unfortunately, no late applications can be accepted because the course planning requires knowledge of the size of the group.
