Sunday 8th April, DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Between 1931 and 1938 Sr Faustina, a Polish nun, saw visions of Our Lord. He asked that the 1st Sunday after Easter (i.e. the 2nd Sunday of Easter) should be a Feast of Mercy, when the image of Jesus as seen by Sr Faustina would be blessed and priests would preach about God's unfathomable mercy. Pope John Paul canonised Sr Faustina on 30th April 2000 and decreed that the 2nd Sunday of Easter would henceforth be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Divine Mercy chaplet is said on ordinary Rosary beads. There are often Divine Mercy Services locally with a number of priests hearing confessions. I am not currently aware of local services but will try to find out and publish details in the Narthex.

We will have a short service here at St Winefride's from 4.30-5.30pm. We will say the Divine Mercy Prayers and I will then be available for confession. If you know of a Divine Mercy Service you will be better going to it than coming here because I am a Divine Mercy novice. If you do know of another service please let me know and I will try to communicate it. Whatever happens I will still be available here from 4.30-5.30pm and will do my best.
