Data Processing Regulations As you are probably all aware there is new legislation on the horizon regarding personal data. This is known as the General Data Protection Regulation or GDPR for short and is effective from 25th May 2018. These new rules mean we will be making some changes to how we hold and use personal data. At the moment we hold personal data about most of our parishioners and for many about their families as well. We will be writing to you soon about how we process your personal data and we would be grateful if you could respond quickly and help us implement these new regulations. If you don't respond we may be obliged to stop contacting you about some things. St John's Seminary, Wonersh. Can you help? The Seminary near Guildford, which has been involved in the formation of priests for over 125 years, is looking for some help with the redecoration & refurbishment of 30 of its rooms, which have received little or no upgrading for 40+ years.
