Mass of the Lord's Supper, 8pm

VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED TO HAVE THEIR FEET WASHED as part of the Liturgy. Please sign the list on the table in the Narthex. **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion** should renew their commitment to their Ministry at this Mass.

VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED TO WATCH BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT on Maundy Thursday evening at various times between the end of Mass and Midnight. There is a list for you to sign up for this.

Good Friday, 30th March

No morning Mass but there will be Prayer of The Church at 9am.

A day of fasting & abstinence

Abstinence means no meat, though fish and eggs are permitted. Those 14 years and over should abstain.

Fasting means one full meal only, with a light breakfast and supper. This applies only to those between 18 and 60 years of age.

The Papal Collection for Holy Places, which will be taken on Good Friday, is used to maintain 74 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. It helps the work of the Church in the Holy Land and elsewhere by the relief of poverty and suffering. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres there rely on assistance from this collection. Gift Aid donors are asked to use a spare envelope and write 'HOLY PLACES' on its front.

Good Friday, Children's Stations of the Cross, 10am

'Share Jesus' final journey' at 10am on Good Friday. This is specially prepared for the children 5-10 years old. We move from Station to Station and the children are given parts to read. Adults are also welcome.

The Easter Vigil, 31st March 8.30pm

I would urge as many of you as can to attend the vigil. The Church describes it as 'the greatest and most noble of all Solemnities' and of course it fulfils your Sunday obligation. Every family should attend at least once in a lifetime.

Reconciliation (Confession) *We are all encouraged to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) regularly. I suggest Lent & Christmas as the minimum, even if your sins are not grave. If we prepare for confession via a priest, we must review our lives in order to decide what to say, whereas a private review may not have the same depth of preparation. For example, it is common in a work situation to review a project regularly with colleagues which requires you to think carefully about it – our project is getting to heaven. According to the Church we are obliged to confess serious sins at least once a year and if you have committed a mortal sin, that is a serious sin committed with full knowledge and full consent (i.e. not under undue pressure) it should be confessed before receiving Communion. The two paragraphs in the Catechism which cover this are 1457 and 1458. 1457 is attractive because it effectively says no confession required if you have not committed a grave sin, but **1458 recommends regular confession of everyday faults**. 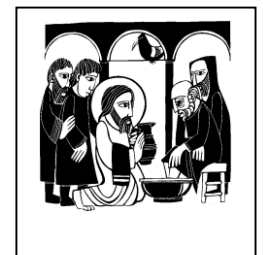

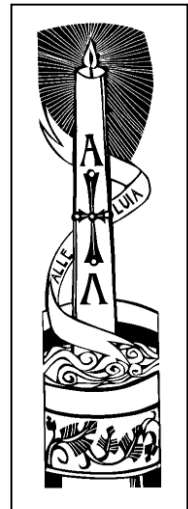
