GENERAL PARISH NOTICES

Easter Communion This Sunday is the last day for fulfilling the precept of Easter Communion i.e. receiving Communion at least once a year during the Easter season unless prohibited from doing so by Church law. Anyone conscious of having committed a grave sin must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before going to Communion.

Day for Life This is the day in the Church's life dedicated to celebrating the sacredness of life. The proceeds from the Day for Life collection provide core funding for the Anscombe Bioethics Centre and to assist other life related activities supported by the Church, usually by means of grants made to support Catholic charities working in the particular field determined by the theme of the year.

Although I shall miss him, as I am sure you will, I am very pleased for him as I know that he is looking forward to returning to full time pastoral ministry.

I hope that Canon John may still be able to concelebrate Mass with me on 8th July as we celebrate the anniversary of our ordinations.
