Confirmation Group Coffee Morning

This year's Confirmation Candidates will be hosting a coffee morning today, Sunday, 19th March, in the Hall after 9.30am Mass. Proceeds will be donated to Water Aid and we do hope you will come along to support the group and this very important cause.

The Church Shop will be open this weekend with a new selection of Confirmation cards and gifts, Easter cards, new rosaries and other items. Come and have a look. **NB:** We will be closed on the day of Confirmation, 26th March.

What Can I do for Lent?

Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving is the Lenten tradition. We **fast** by eating less on Fridays, but giving up something (e.g. chocolate or alcohol) is also **fasting**. Extra **prayer** is very important; try one of these:

- Say some additional prayers each day.
- Go to weekday Mass if you can.
- Choose one of the Gospels and read it during Lent.
- Study the Sunday readings before coming to Mass (the next week's readings are listed in the newsletter).
- Come to the Stations of the Cross on Sundays.
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Confirmation Mass

On Sunday, 26th March, we will welcome Bishop Paul Hendricks at the 11am Mass. All are welcome, but you should note that the first 6 benches on each side of the centre aisle will be reserved for the Confirmation Candidates and their families.

Update on the Church Frontage

Thank you to all the Parishioners who provided feedback on the scope of the initial brief document, detailing the proposed landscaping and accessibility works to the front of the church. The comments covered a range of views, with several suggesting that the brief should be more comprehensive.

With that in mind, the intention is now to explore the possibility of having a longer term estate master-plan drawn out by the architects, encompassing the main items that Parishioners have put forward over various consultations at Parish Assemblies. The landscaping and accessibility works would represent a self-contained first phase of the plan upon which we would aim to move swiftly to achieve acceptable disabled access. Subsequent phases of this broader master-plan would be addressed as and when appropriate.

Five architectural practices have now been identified and approached. The next steps are to arrange initial meetings with each of these practices, assess their initial proposals and corresponding fees, and then proceed with the selection and appointment of an architect.

Could you help to clean the church brass, altar candles & candle stands?

These all need cleaning once per week and can be done at a time to suit volunteers' convenience. If a sufficient number of you could help we could have a rota of cleaners for this. Contact the parish office.
