The Eucharist was called the 'medicine of immortality' by St Ignatius of Antioch (2nd century). The Bread of Life gives us Life! **Please Note:** next Sunday 4 July we have First Holy Communions at both the 9.30 & 11am Masses.

**Spiritual Communion Prayer** *My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.*

**The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul** is on Tuesday 29 June. It is a holyday of obligation but the Sunday and Holyday obligation is still suspended because of the pandemic. The Vigil Mass is on Monday 28 June at 7pm and Mass at 9.30am on Tuesday 29 June. Priestly ordinations often take place on this day so let us pray for those ordained to the Priesthood this year and for vocations. A basket will be in the narthex for the traditional PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION (and a contactless link on the devices/website) which reflects our bond with the Pope and the See of Rome and helps support humanitarian causes supported by the Pope, as well as poor dioceses throughout the world.

**The Day of Prayer for Human Life** was last Sunday 20 June. Baskets for the second collection are still available in the narthex and it is also possible to make a donation on one of our contactless devices – just press 'DAY FOR LIFE'.

**A Booking & Seating System** is in operation for ALL Sunday Masses until further notice – Saturday 6pm

and Sunday 8am, 9.30am & 11am. The additional 8am Mass will end when restrictions are lifted. It would be very helpful to arrive 5-10 minutes before Mass starts. I appreciate that this is not always possible, but time does need to be taken to ensure safe seating arrangements. Our stewards are doing great work and all we can do to help them would be much appreciated. In order to maintain safe distancing we will place a CHURCH FULL notice at the main doors if necessary. Thank you all very much for all you have done and are doing to ensure safe practices are in place so that our church remains open for Mass. **If you can, please try to book by 2pm on the Friday for the coming weekend(s). This gives us time to prepare seating plans. Please bear in mind that booking is even more important on the Sundays between 27 June-11 July, especially the 11am Mass.**

**What's in a Name?** Thursday 24 June was the Solemnity of the Birth of St John the Baptist. The Gospel is taken from Luke chapter 1 - the naming of John the Baptist. All thought he would be called Zechariah after his father, but his mother said he was to be called John. His father, who had lost the power of speech, wrote, 'His name is John.' At that very moment Zechariah's speech returned and he praised God. St Maximus of Turin (5th century) comments: *As we celebrate the birthday of St John the Baptist today, I would like to be quiet and with silence set bounds to my labour and to my inexperience, but the power of his name does not permit me to be still. For the very sounding of his name draws out the secrets of our hearts and unlooses what is hidden in our silence, and what is brushed over in concealment is pressed into the open in wonderment. For if even his father Zechariah received back his voice when he named him, how much more are we promised abundant speech when we praise him! And is his father's mouth opened when he was born in the world, how much more is our mouth fruitful when it is opened for Christ.*
