Tree of Heaven I am delighted to announce that Richmond Council Planning Committee unanimously voted to allow us to fell the Tree of Heaven.

On your behalf I would like to thank Peter Nixon who spent a great deal of time researching and preparing our case and presented it very firmly to the Planning Committee; Juliet Thompson, who did a great deal of research before asking Peter to prepare our case and explained to the committee how expensive the tree was to maintain; Sir David Durie, who explained with statistics and a photograph how damaging the tree is to the surrounding area and also presented a letter of support from the Kew Society.

Church Improvement Working Party Now that the situation with the Tree of Heaven is clear we are anxious to get to work as soon as possible on developing plans for disabled access and associated landscaping. We need Parishioners with relevant skills e.g. architects, landscapers, those familiar with disability issues, to agree to join a working party to move this forward. Children's Liturgy Groups This is the time of year that children who are in Year 1 and above at school can move up to the Junior Group. This year we have something to celebrate with the recent approval to remove the Tree of Heaven. The removal of the tree will pave the way for us to begin the improvement of our disabled access and the enhancement of our garden (please see separate notice re a Working Party).

As in previous years, and in the spirit of community, we ask that parishioners contribute the finger food for the reception and there will be charts in the Narthex for you to sign up for the items you are able to provide.
