The Season of Creation is a global ecumenical celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home, starting each year on 1 September and finishing on the feast of St Francis of Assisi, 4 October. This year's celebration takes place in the context of the special Laudato Si' Anniversary Year, which Pope Francis opened on 24 May 2021 to coincide with the fifth anniversary of his encyclical. The Cry of Creation – A Study Day on Laudato Si' is a free event on Saturday 4 September 11am-1230pm, given by Fr Ashley Beck, a Southwark priest and Associate Professor at St Mary's University. Churches Together in Kew: Climate Sunday on 5 September. The Climate Sunday initiative is calling on all local churches across Great Britain

and Ireland to hold a climate-focussed service on any Sunday before COP26 in November 2021. The vision of Churches Together in Great Britain and Ireland is to leave a lasting legacy of thousands of churches better equipped to address this critical issue as part of their discipleship and mission and to make a significant contribution to civil society efforts to secure adequate national and international action at COP26. Here in Kew many people are concerned about the existential threat posed by climate change. As a parish, we share in that concern and want to do all we can to protect our common home.

Confirmation 2021/2022 Registration is now open for those in years 10-13 who wish to be Confirmed. Please email the parish office with your details: full name, address, school attended. Please also mention if you were Baptised at St Winefride's. If you were not Baptised here, we will need a copy of your Baptism certificate. Registration will remain open until 15 October. Once we have an idea of the size of the group we can make more detailed plans for the course, given that we still have to be aware of Covid-19 protocols, etc. We look forward to the start of the Confirmation programme (probably during Advent).

The New Academic Year is almost upon us and many young people and their families are preparing for the return to school, starting at new schools, either primary or secondary, or moving to third level education. Many teachers, support staff and governors are also busy with the imminent start of a new academic year. The last 18 months has heightened our awareness of the primacy of education and the vocation of the teacher. Parents are the first teachers of their children in faith and in life. We have become aware of the great vocation of teaching at home and in schools, colleges and universities. We pray for all students, parents and families, and teachers as they embark on a new year of learning. **Education Sunday** will be celebrated this year on 12 September. There will be a second collection for the Catholic Education Service.

Late Summer Drinks Evening on 12 Sept 5-7pm for all members of the parish – individuals, couples and families. All are welcome. We look forward to this informal gathering as the summer holidays end and the academic year begins. Importantly, too, this will be our first parish social gathering for a very long time and the opportunity to meet over a drink and canapés. The emphasis is on 'informal' and we can arrive and leave as our circumstances permit. To help with catering a sign-up sheet is on the red notice board in the narthex. Please sign up if you plan to attend, indicating numbers where appropriate. Alternatively, you can email the parish office. There is no need to bring anything, except yourselves.
