The Rosary in October

Those who recite 5 decades of the Rosary in church, or as a family, a religious community, or as a group of the faithful, may gain a plenary indulgence daily; in other circumstances a partial indulgence. A partial indulgence may be obtained daily by reciting the Litany of Loreto and the Prayer to Saint Joseph. There are some brief notes on indulgences in the Narthex for you to take if you wish.
