**Fr Tom's Farewell Mass**

We will celebrate a special farewell Mass for Fr Tom on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> October at 6pm. Mass will be followed by a drinks reception in the Church Hall where hors d'oeuvres will be served. It would be lovely to see as many of you as possible to celebrate with Fr Tom as we thank him for his many years of dedicated service to our parish and his well-earned retirement. For those who prefer a daytime celebration there will be a special coffee morning on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> October after both of the morning Masses. The 9:30 Mass will be a Children's Mass, giving the children in particular an opportunity to celebrate with Fr Tom.

**Parish Office**

It is a very busy time for the Parish Office with Secondary School applications and preparing for Fr Tom's impending retirement and the arrival of Fr Francis Lynch. If you wish to speak to Fr Tom or Julia during office hours please email in the first instance or telephone. Thank you for your patience.

**Use of the Church Porch (Narthex)**

The porch is the entrance area between the external wooden and interior glass doors. There are notices on the church doors with the heading 'Young Children at Mass' which say 'Do not feel embarrassed if your child cries or has a tantrum'. It also says to take them out to the porch (Narthex) temporarily. However, the use of the porch during Mass should be strictly limited. I have noticed that some people stay in the porch for most of the Mass and this should not happen. There are too many temptations for children to move about and talk. They should be learning to sit quietly in church and you should try to point out actions in the Mass to your children.

### Late for Mass?

I know that I sometimes start Mass a few minutes late although I try not to do so. Ideally the Mass should always start on time and everyone should be there on time. I realise that there will be times when you may be late for various reasons, especially if you have small children, however there is a danger that late coming could become a habit and you should certainly not be arriving after the start of the Readings (Liturgy of The Word).

### Church Shop

From October and in response to requests from parishioners, the shop will be displaying Advent calendars and candles for sale. We hope this early Christmas start will be of benefit to those wishing to post items abroad.

**The Rosary in October** Those who recite 5 decades of the Rosary in church, or as a family, a religious community, or as a group of the faithful, may gain a plenary indulgence daily; in other circumstances a partial indulgence. A partial indulgence may be obtained daily by reciting the Litany of Loreto and the Prayer to Saint Joseph. There are some brief notes on indulgences in the Narthex for you to take if you wish.

The aim is to raise money for CAFOD's work with the poor. Please take an envelope and gift aid if you can. Envelopes should be returned via the normal Mass collection next Sunday, 7<sup>th</sup> October.
